REMEMBERING

he Concho Valley Nurses Honor Guard is a group of nurses whose goal is to provide a dignified Nightingale ceremony within a funeral, memorial or graveside service to those nurses in the community who have passed away. This group, started by nurses who have retired from Shannon, believes that every nurse should have the opportunity to be honored for their service.

This special group started in San Angelo when Judy Lynn Kilgore, a friend of Cathy Ornelas Highsmith, one of the founding members and a former nurse of Shannon of 40 years, was on hospice and asked her to do something special for the service. After researching and making contact with Julia Godby-Murray, the woman who has spearheaded the National Nurses Honor Guard Coalition, Cathy teamed up with Rosemary Zapata, a former nurse of Shannon of 33 years, to begin honoring nurses at their services in the Concho Valley. This group is the first chapter of the Nurses Honor Guard in West Texas and the second in the entire state.

"Judy is the reason we started this," Cathy said. "She saw this organization and saw how fulfilling it was. Initially, I thought we would only do all of this for her, but we realized the need for a Nurses Honor Guard in our area. She did not pass until we had already done six services, so she was able to see the impact she made."

Since their first service, Cathy and Rosemary have recruited six additional nurses to the

Guard. Their goal is to ultimately have enough members to attend every funeral service of nurses who have passed away in San Angelo and the surrounding areas.

"We have had numerous family

members and friends come up to us afterwards and express how grateful they are to have had such a special presentation to memorialize their loved one," Rosemary said. "It really does show the impact a nurse is able to make on people's lives for the hard work and dedication they put into their career of helping others."

Every member of the Nurses Honor Guard dresses in the traditional white uniform, complete with cape and cap. At each ceremony, they will read the Nightingale Tribute, a proclamation to recognize the fallen nurse. They then



place a white rose and light a lamp candle to symbolize their honor and appreciation for the individual's service. All nurses will then stand for a final roll call, where the nurse's name will be called three times—each time after a bell is rung. The Honor Guard will then officially release them of their nursing duties, and the lamp's flame will be extinguished.

"Most people have only seen presentations like this at military, police or first responders' funerals," Cathy said. "Those individuals are very deserving of the tributes to their service. We want people to see how necessary something of this capacity is to all the nurses who have given so much to their own line of service of caring for their patients."

Today, there are over 120 Nurses Honor Guards across the country. The Nurses Honor Guard of the Concho Valley welcomes any nurses interested in joining their chapter.

"Putting my cap on and looking in the mirror after all these years was a feeling I cannot describe," Rosemary said. "This group allows me to continue the pledge I took as a new nurse. It truly feels like a ministry and a connection from our past to the present and future."

Nightingale ceremonies are available for any licensed or registered nurse that has passed away; they are provided at no charge, however, the chapter does accept donations.

The Shannon Access Clinic is proud to provide the Annual Wellness Program—a service offered to Medicare patients at no cost. This program provides patients the opportunity to speak with a Provider to discuss medical and surgical histories, as well as preventative care and screenings. The main goal of this program is to help discover potential health risks or issues and create a preventative care plan for the individual.

Shannon Access Clinic Provides Important Preventative Programs for Medicare Patients

An Annual Wellness appointment will include:

- Consult on medical, surgical and family history
- Measurement of height, weight, BMI and blood pressure
- Ordering preventative testing/screenings that may be needed (e.g. colonoscopies, Dexa scans, mammograms, etc.)
- Administering vaccines, such as pneumonia and flu
- Advance Care Planning

To be eligible for an Annual Wellness visit, patients must be covered by Medicare for at least one year. Typically this service is for those ages 65 and older, but younger individuals may be covered due to disabilities.
